NOTES FROM THE AUTOCRAT

The event went very smoothly – there were no major incidents.

Injuries: There were 3 hand injuries, 2 minor and 1 broken thumb. On site we had 2 nurses and 3 paramedics.

Feast: Although I hear the feast went off okay, there are problems having a feast at a camping event, especially one as busy as Fall Coronet. Activities during the day ran long, pushing Royal Court back an hour, so the feast started an hour and a half late and impacted other planned activities that evening. Autocrats should seriously consider the more fluid schedule of camping events before planning a feast.

Gate: Any money taken in advance of someone's actual arrival on site should be put in a separate envelope and only added to general Gate funds once the person has arrived. At Coronet 2 people were paid for in advance, but only one showed up. The second person was never added to the Gate sheets, of course, but the money had been added to the Gate funds and caused some frustration when balancing the books until the cause of the frustration was discovered.

Heraldry: Note to future autocrats – field heraldry and town crying are two different heraldry offices at a camping event and should be assigned to different people.

Recommendation: It is my recommendation that one of the Championships be moved to one of the other Tir Righ events in the year. Trying to balance the Coronet Tourney and 2 championships as well as all the other necessary activities was tricky. Perhaps Bardic could be moved to November Investiture; bardic competitions are more suitable to an indoor venue than archery is.
